Arrived at Belem Easter Sunday about 2 P.M. We read the Army Services for Easter while enroute but I wished I could have gone to church but it was impossible. Joe had tried to find out when I was arriving in Belem, but of course couldn't get the exact time but they told him which day. He was there and finally reached the airport about a half hour after I landed. Our friends gave a little party for us in Belem and Joe left for Manaus on Monday, April 2nd. I stayed with the plane and came in to Manaus the following Friday, April 6th, or 7th, don't know which date and haven't any calendar.

Well, that's the Rio story and I know you're worn out. I am glad to be back and settle down and enjoy our home again. Everyone has been so nice to us since we returned and I did miss all our friends. Only wish you folks and Joe could have been with me down there.

Joe now has auditors in the office here and that is keeping him very busy. They arrived three days ago and we are entertaining them to dinner tomorrow night. We entertained the army boys last evening to dinner as I feel their life is a bit dull here with no ties or home life at all. I think they enjoyed it and I know we did. The American doctor, Dr. Beaton and his wife and two sons, left this morning and we'll surely miss them. Dr. Murray and family, our friends from Africa, are arriving Monday so we must give them some kind of a reception since Joe and I are the only ones who know him here. We are both fine and hope you folks, Pa and Bernice and all are grand too. Give our love to all and write soon and give us all the dope. Hope you're not worn out. Heaps of love and kisses, from

Mexican Workers Now in New Location

Approximately 175 Mexican nationals now in the valley working in fruit orchards were moved Friday and Saturday from Camp Prescott to new quarters in army barracks at the Medford air field. The move was made necessary when the cook house at Camp Prescott burned last Tuesday.

A Growers' committee has requested that 1900 Mexican nationals be stationed here during the peak of the harvest season, by arrangements with the War Food Administration. It is expected that fewer than this number will be available however, as more Mexican workers will be needed in the eastern and northern sections of Oregon to replace Japanese internees used last year.
