A Great Heritage

The fighting men and women of this community are returning home from war with a fervent new appreciation of America's blessings, a strong determination to preserve these blessings, and a keen desire to continue to be helpful to their country and fellowmen.

This was the statement today of Commander Joe Krupp of Myers-Holland Post 129 of the American Legion here in explaining the great influx of honorably discharged World War II Veterans into Legion ranks not only locally but nationally.

"The American Legion nationally has now enrolled more than 599,000 World War II Veterans," he said, "raising the 1945 membership to a record high of more than 1,625,000. "More than 20 local World War II Veterans have affiliated themselves with the local Post," he added. "All 1945 membership records will be smashed in 1946," he predicted. "The 1946 membership campaign is now under way."

"Local World War II Veterans are joining The American Legion," Commander Krupp said, "because they believe in democracy, in American free institutions in making future peace secure, in rehabilitation of veterans and their dependents, and in public service as exemplified by Legion programs. They also believe that veterans should stick together and that the Legion being already a well-established and tried-and-tested organization, is the place to stick." Commander Krupp stated, "The new veterans will take over the Legion, lock, stock and barrel."

The Legion with its \$100,000,000 in assets, its splendid clubhouses and fine programs, traditions and ideals, is a great heritage for World War II veterans.

Expressing his personal gratification over the enrollment of so many of the new veterans, Commander Krupp declared: "I am happy to see the new veterans coming home imbued with the same patriotic fervor that inspire the founders of the Legion in 1919. This is the finest guarantee this nation can have that the veterans of this war will not shed their services to God and Country with their uniforms; that they will throw their energies and battle-tested courage to the solution of the problems of peace; that they will stand as a living bulwark of our free institutions for which they fought even as World War I Legionnaires fought and in the defense of which many of their comrades gave their lives. We welcome every War II veteran into the Legion because it is an organization of veterans, by veterans and for veterans, consecrated to service to God and Country."

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Bob Burns Member Destroyer Jarvis Crew

Robert G. Burns TM-3c is a crew member of the USS Jarvis. Mr. Burns is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Ray Burns of Central Point. His wife, Mrs. E. C. Burns live at 1117 West 11st, Medford. He was employed last with the U.S. Bureau of Mines, Salt Lake City. He enlisted April 3, 1943 and received a promotion November 1, 1944. He reported on board June 3, 1944. Mr. Burns' duty was to keep and operation of tube mount No. 2. He was overseas 12 months. Before this he was a student at Key Port, Washington.

On the USS Jarvis in Mutsu Bay, Japan, Sept. 9 (Delayed)—This destroyer today setamed into Mutsu Bay on the northern coast of the main Japanese island of Honshu as part of the Aleutian-based 9th Fleet, which is occupying Ominato naval base and Hokkaido, northern main home island.

As the ship, commanded by Cmdr. Ernest B. Ellsworth, USN, of San Diego, Calif., sailed through the channel, sharpshooters occasionally would fire at floating mines.

The warm sun and calm seas were a welcome relief to the men, most of whom were on deck in shirt sleeves. In the northern Kuriles, the JARVIS encountered in the weather a much worse foe than he Japs.

In the first of eight shore bombardments before peace came, 70-foot waves tossed the ship. Disregarding the unpleasantness of eating from a tray that slid across the table with each roll and trying to sleep on an ever-shifting bunk, the crew interrupted transportation of food to the Japanese home islands by destruction of fish canneries on Paramushiru, by making the air strip on Matsushima inoperative and sinking ships in the Sea of Okhotsk.
