

Cpl. John Snook Receives Citation

Cpl. John C. Snook of route 1, box 97, Central Point, has been cited by Maj. Gen. Bradley of the 96th division, for "meritorious achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy on Leyte island from Oct. 20, 1944, to Dec. 31, 1944, and on Okinawa island from April 1, 1945, to June 22, 1945," and a copy of the citation has been forwarded to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Snook.

The citation relates that "during the Leyte campaign Corporal, then technician fifth grade, Snook, was detailed as driver of a cargo truck which hauled ammunition, water, rations and medical supplies through the worst of roads and climate conditions. On numerous occasions he operated over road nets and through terrain subjected to enemy observation and fire.

"On Okinawa, Cpl. Snook served as first battalion transportation corporal, and as such was responsible for the maintenance and dispatching of all trucks in the battalion section. When Okinawa was turned into a sea of mud due to torrential rains, Cpl. Snook worked ceaselessly and tirelessly in his task of getting his vehicles loaded with ammunition, rations and water and to insure that they got to their battalions. By using artillery tractors and any other means possible, he succeeded in delivering the supplies with great effectiveness and success.

"Most of the routes over which he traveled were constructed through enemy mine fields and subjected to enemy sniper, machine gun and artillery fire. In addition he voluntarily made independent reconnaissance to endeavor to find better routes of advance, which was successful on many occasions. Cpl. Snook's devotion to duty and manner of performance was a great source of pride to all who served with him."

Cpl. Snook, in the army three years, trained at Camp White with the 96th division and in a recent letter to his parents stated he expected to be home by the middle of November. His wife and daughter live in Westwood, Calif. The corporal attended school at Prospect.—The Mail Tribune.

Robt. Kyle, Jr. Is Given Bronze Medal

Pfc. Robert F. Kyle, Jr., a son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert F. Kyle, Sr., 609 South Oakdale avenue, has been awarded a bronze star medal for heroic action during the European campaign according to information received by his parents from headquarters of the 100th Infantry division. Pfc. Kyle is now in Pforzheim, Germany.

He also received a citation for heroic action when he made repeated trips over the treacherous enemy shelled road, carrying casualties to medical installations and bringing vitally needed ammunition to the front lines. Engineers removed three hostile teller mines from the road in the morning.

The young man holds in addition to the newly awarded bronze star, the purple heart, combat infantryman's badge, one battle star, the good conduct medal and presidential unit citation.

Pfc. Kyle has been overseas since October of 1944.

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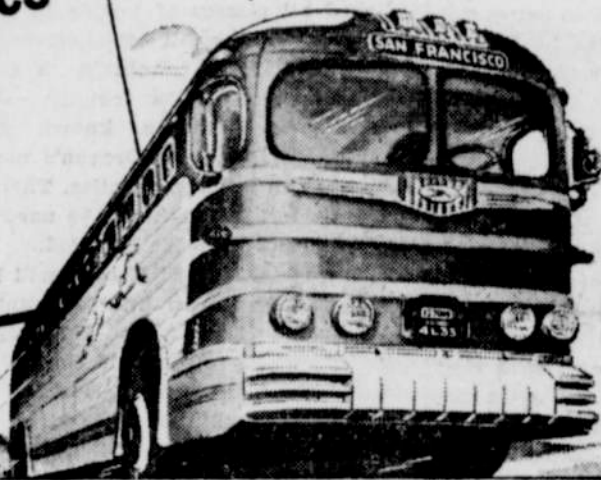


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
