

## Plan More Highway First Aid Stations

Mr. Miles J. Handy, Red Cross Field Representative for First Aid Accident Prevention and Water Safety, from San Francisco spent Friday and Saturday of this week conferring with Mr. Maurice Tedrow, Medford County Aid Chairman and Mr. Robert Dodge, Ashland County Water Safety Chairman.

Because of the Post War increase in traffic accidents on a National scale—American Red Cross is completing a survey and inspection of all Highway Emergency Aid Stations.

Mr. Handy visited the station at Prospect in charge of Mr. and Mrs. H. J. Grieve, Shady Cove in charge of Ellnor Mee and Mrs. Eva Egeessman, Brownsboro handled by Mrs. Vera Wright and Mr. A. R. Rutledge and Siskiyou Patrol Station in charge of Miss Vera Lutz. The Rogue River Station has been recently closed since Mrs. Miller is now teaching.

Mr. Handy approved plans made by Mr. Tedrow for opening of several new stations for County, and tentative arrangements were made for a First Aid Instructors School in January to be held in both Medford and Ashland. Mr. Dodge requested Water Safety Instructors School later in spring in preparation for the Annual Swim Campaign.

## Southern Pacific to Discontinue Ship Line

A. T. Mercler, President of Southern Pacific Company, announced today that the company had determined that it would not exercise the authority granted it by the ICC to resume operations of steamships between New York, Y.N. and Galveston and Houston, Texas.

This announcement marks the complete discontinuance of Southern Pacific Company Morgan Line Service between North Atlantic and Gulf ports which was established February 1, 1933 and which was interrupted in June 1941 when the United States Government requisitioned the Morgan Line fleet.

## To foster and perpetuate a one hundred per cent Americanism

—From the Preamble to the Constitution of The American Legion



ONE OF THE CONTINUING TASKS OF THE AMERICAN LEGION HAS BEEN TO COMBAT THE SPREAD OF ALIEN IDEOLOGIES THAT WERE BROUGHT TO THIS LAND IN THE WAKE OF WORLD WAR I AND MAY AGAIN FOLLOW IN THE WAKE OF WORLD WAR II. BY CEASELESS VIGILANCE TO OPPOSE THOSE WHO ARE UN-AMERICAN, BY PURPOSEFUL EDUCATION TO GUIDE THOSE WHO ARE AMERICAN; THESE ARE THE AMERICANISM AIMS OF THE LEGION.

Americanism is an idealism concerning our American way of life. It implies a sincere faith and belief in a democratic, representative form of government with certain checks and balances to prevent usurpation of power that might impair our government of the people, by the people, and for the people.

It stands for individual rights, fair play, tolerance, justice, recognition of individual ability, and reasonableness in all phases of American living. We cannot condone Americanism as sponsored by intolerant secret societies. Neither can we accept as the American way selfish, unjust practices of powerful groups in our industrial life.

We must guard with all our energy the human rights guaranteed by the Constitution. Destructive theories fostered by foreign money and influence aimed at the possible weakening or overthrow of our form of government must be combatted with all legitimate means. Liberty under the law must not be extended to protect license, anarchy, or treason under the law.

In our efforts to combat un-American influence, we must not, however, become such self-righteous super-patriots that we interpret those who argue for orderly change as un-American and thereby injure a loyal fellow citizen.

## Army To End Three-Year Program at Oregon State

After nearly three years activity on this campus, the Army Specialized Training program will end here Dec. 31 with a record of 3023 different men enrolled for college studies. Close of the program will release the entire men's dormitory for civilian use next term, making room for 22 additional students.

The Oregon State ASTP unit was the first to be started in the Ninth Service command, in March 1943, and it is now the last in the northwest to be closed. Of the 290 men in the unit this term, about 40 still have some training due which they will get at the University of Utah.

Col. Maylon Scott, newly appointed commandant succeeding Lt. Col. Glenn Webster, will be in charge of the army ROTC program which will continue on the campus together with the newly established navy ROTC unit.
