

Central Point & J'ville Lead League Divisions

As the Southern Oregon class "B" basketball league nears the halfway mark it appeared that Jacksonville, leading division one, and Central Point, top division two team, would be the quintets to play off for the league championship the first part of March.

Jacksonville, with three wins and two defeats, is being pressed by Phoenix, Gold Hill and Butte Falls, all tied for second place with two wins and two losses. Gold Hill goes to Butte Falls and Phoenix moves to Prospect.

Swains Move to Belem, Para, Brazil

Belem, Para, Brazil.
October 18, 1945

Dear Folks:

Well, here we are living in Belem, and perhaps we can have a little better mail service. Won't that seem good?

The people in Belem, Parkinsons, from whom we arranged to get this house in Belem, notified us that they were departing for South Brazil on October 8th and suggested that one of us arrive in Belem not later than October 7th to declare residence here and to guard the house from burglary as there is so much stealing in this section of Brazil. Joe booked passage for me on October 7th and we arranged to close the Manaus house the afternoon of October 6th. All trunks were packed and the last suitcase closed when an emergency arose. One of the R.D.C. fellows had just received word from the States that his mother was in a very grave condition, perhaps dying, and he couldn't get a seat on the Pan-Airco Brazil plane out of Manaus in order to connect with a plane to the States and, of course he wished to leave immediately. There was another RDC person on the scheduled flight of October 7th beside myself but she refused to give up her seat for any reason. She came to Brazil when Joe and I returned down here from our vacation and had only been here since the 1st of August, had no reason to go home except that she was tired of Manaus. I volunteered my seat to the poor fellow and the

gratefulness of the kid was enough to repay me for any small inconvenience to me. Joe was with me a hundred percent and he wired one of the fellows in the office in Belem to hire someone to sleep in our house until I could get down here, also to pay the Parkinsons' maid to live here and buy her food until I come.
