Hi School Anticipates Heavy Increase in Fall

An over-flow enrollment in September, 1946, is anticipated, according to H. P. Jewett, principal of the Central Point Schools.

The matter was placed before students in a recent assembly, at which time Mr. Jewett announced that a pre-registration survey will be made in the near future.

Fifty freshmen have been enrolled in the present school year and there is reason to believe, Mr. Jewett says, that next year's freshman class will be as large as this year's, if not larger.

If this happens and the present junior and sophomore classes retain their present size, building facilities will be crowded to the utmost with an all-time enrollment.

Increase in the size of the school is in line with a similar increase in other schools on the west coast. The war has brought a great shift of

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population to the west with a consequent lack of adequate housing and schooling facilities, according to Mr. Jewett.
