

Grade School Slates Annual Tournament

Invitations for a grade school basketball tournament to be held at the Central Point gymnasium on March 15 and 16, have been sent to fourteen schools in the county. The tournament is sponsored by the Central Point Schools and will be under the direction of Harold Boner, Central Point Elementary Principal. Trophies will be awarded for first and second place and for consolation winner. Schools participating will be Bellevue, Howard, Lone Pine, Oak Grove, Phoenix, Talent, Jacksonville, Gold Hill, Rogue River, Evans Valley, Eagle Point, Butte Falls, Prospect, and Central Point. All games up to the finals will be played cross court, two games at a time.

This is the third annual tournament sponsored by the Central Point Schools. The last tournament was held in 1941 and was won by the Evans Valley school.

Pointers Victorious Over Talent High

During the fourth quarter the Pointers scored 11 points to the Bulldog's 5. The Pointer seconds played the last four minutes of the game but failed to score. The game ended 43 to 26, another win for the Central Point team.

Leading the winners with 14 points, Tom Colley was also high point man in the game. Frink of Talent was second highest scorer with 12 points, and Saxbury of the Pointers was a close third with 11 points.

The Pointer seconds ran the score up to 24-2 against the Talent seconds in the first half of the preliminary. The Pointers thirds took over in the second half and held Talent to 3 points as they made 14. The game ended 38 to 5 with the Pointers leading.
