

Annual Invitation Basketball Tourney Now Under Way

Southern Oregon College—March 4, 1946—The sixteenth annual Southern Oregon College Invitation Basketball Tournament will open at one o'clock Wednesday afternoon, March 6th, with fourteen games on the bracket for that afternoon and evening. Twenty games are scheduled for Thursday; ten games for Friday; and four finals for Saturday—two in the afternoon and two in the evening. The Southern Oregon College campus will resound to the whistles, horns, and gongs of the officials in forty-eight contests during the four days of tournament play.

Twenty seven teams, representing nine counties, were placed on the 1946 tournament bracket last Friday afternoon as President Stevenson of Southern Oregon College made the drawings.

The participating teams come from the following schools: Coos County, Coos River; Curry County, Brookings, Gold Beach, Langlois, and Ophir; Douglas County, Camas Valley, Drain, Elkton, Glendale, Myrtle Creek and Oakland; Harney County, Burns; Jackson County, Point, Gold Hill, Jacksonville, Phoenix Falls, Central Point, Eagle, Prospect, Rogue River, St. Mary's and Talent; Jefferson County, Madras; Josephine County, Kerby; Klamath County, Chiloquin, Gilchrist, Merrill; Lake County, Paisley. Every phase of the four-day competition is being carefully checked by Southern Oregon College officials to insure a smooth-running and successful meeting.
