

New Gym at Rogue River is Planned

Cooperative effort in the establishment of a large athletic plant at Rogue River has been pledged by the Rogue River Veterans of Foreign Wars post and the school board, according to Alf B. Mekvold, principal of the Rogue River schools.

Included in the project are a turf football field, a quarter mile track and 220-yard straight-away track, baseball and softball diamonds, tennis courts and bleachers.

Plans for preliminary survey and blue prints were launched when Stevenson met with the school board. Proposal to include flood lights in the project was vetoed by the group.

"On-the-job Training Offered to Veterans

How the Oregon veteran can establish himself in on-the-job training under the GI bill of rights is explained in a bulletin prepared and released this week by Hugh E. Rosson, Department of Veterans' Affairs director.

The four-page bulletin sets forth simply the steps the veteran must take in order to receive the training subsistence allowances granted him during his period of learning in an occupation, to augment his salary.

It warns, however, that "government funds provided under this pro-

gram are not intended as a dole for the veteran nor as a means whereby the employer gets cheap labor at government expense. These funds are intended to train the veteran for his own future security as well as to provide industry with skilled men."

The veteran is advised to certify his eligibility for job-training with the Veterans Administration as early as possible to avoid delays in drawing his allowances once he has obtained a job under the program. His next step, after getting a job, is to contact his local apprentice coordinator to arrange a training schedule and related studies pertaining to his job, the bulletin says.

Oregon's 24 coordinators covering the state are listed in the bulletin, which is being mailed to county service officers, all veterans' organizations, and local selective service boards. Copies are available at the Department of Veterans' Affairs, State Library building, Salem.

Officials of the state department of vocational educational and of the state apprenticeship council, which cooperate in setting up and supervising the job-training program, assisted in preparing the bulletin.

Homemakers Days Start in April In Nine Counties

Homemakers Days will open in nine Oregon counties having emergency assistants and new home demonstration agents this April, reports Frances Clinton, assistant state home demonstration leader with headquarters at Oregon State college. Homemakers Days give interested people in the counties an opportunity to become familiar with home economics extension activities.

Prineville will be the center of the first Homemaker Day. Other April all-day sessions have been scheduled for April 9, Dallas, Polk county; April 10, Tillamook; April 12, Corvallis, Benton county; April 18, Astoria, Clatsop county; April 19, Toledo or Newport, Lincoln county; April 23, Hood River; April 24, Heppner, Morrow county; and April 26, Ontario, Malheur county.

Miss Lois Lutz, extension specialist in home management, will assist Miss Clinton in taking program material and speakers from the college to the various county sessions. Exhibits will include house dresses from Washington, D.C., showing ease of movement and simplicity in laundering!

Alta Fescue With Subclover Found Best Pasture Mix

Western Oregon farmers faced with the problem of what to sow on the so-called "red hill" soils where a permanent pasture is desired can best plant alta fescue in mixture with Tallarook subterranean clover, according to a newly published Circular of Information No. 376 en.

Results of Permanent Pasture Grass and Legume Experiment. Red Soils Experimental Area at Oregon City" by Edwin Keltner, superintendent.

As a project of the Oregon State college experiment station, six pasture grasses in general use in western Oregon were seeded alone and in mixture with subterranean clover and white clover in the fall of 1940. The grasses were: English rye grass, chewing fescue, alta fescue, red creeping fescue, orchard grass and highland bent grass. Seeding rates and fertilizer applications are included in the circular.

All of the plots received pasturing

throughout the summer months by a herd of dairy heifers. From the palatability standpoint, English rye grass was the number one choice followed by little preference between alta fescue and orchard grass. The English rye grass provided only a short pasture season, however, and was gone soon after the rains ceased. The cattle showed a distinct liking for the mixed grass and clover seedings over grass planted alone.

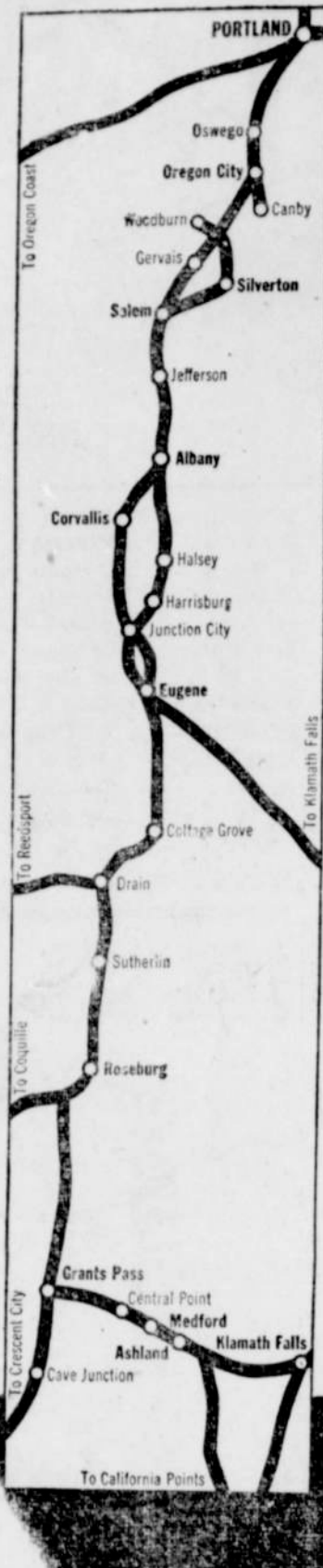
On the basis of observations and yield, alta fescue and Tallarook subterranean clover fertilized with 100 pounds of treble phosphate each fall proved to be the most desirable combination for a permanent pasture.

This mixture rated well toward the top in palatability and produced a continued growth throughout the dry summer months. By its vigorous growth it practically eliminated foreign grasses and weeds after three years of pasturing.

The subterranean clover increased rather than decreased its stands in spite of constant pasturing.
