Mrs. Everett Faber Attends P.T.A. Meet

The Central Point Unit of the Parent Teacher Association was represented at the recent State Convention at LaGrande by the new local president, Mrs. Everett A. Faber.

In giving a report of the Sessions to the Local Unit last Friday, Mrs. Faber, mentioned the beautiful country, waving wheat fields and rolling hills. She spoke of the vast quantities of wheat which have been stored in until just recently in the huge grain elevators in Eastern Oregon.

The highlights of the convention was the inspirational talks by Mrs. John E. Hayes of Idaho, the Publicity Chairman for the National Congress. The theme "Tomorrow Begins Today" was developed by various speakers and culminated with the address by Mrs. Hayes entitled "What of Tomorrow."

Other speakers included Dr. Roben Maaske, Pres. of Eastern Oregon College of Education; Dr. Ivan Milhaus, head of the Dept. of Ed. & Psychology, College of Education at Monmouth; Mr. Fred Patton, Supt. of Schools at La Grande; Dr. Rex Putman, State Supt. of Public Instruction; and Dr. O. C. Chambers, Head of the Dept. of Phy. at O.S.C. at Corvallis.

Mrs. Harry H. George of Portland is President of the Oregon Congress and presided at the Session. Mrs. H. C. Obye, of Grants Pass, is a state vice-president and will be one of the three delegates from Oregon to the National Congress, being held next week in Denver.

Much emphasis was given the Bill being sponsored by the Parent Teacher Congress of Oregon, the Oregon State Association of School Boards and Oregon Education Association. This bill provides for the creating of a Basic School Support Fund to authorize the levy of an annual state school tax sufficient to produce fifty dollars per capita for each child in the state between the ages of four and twenty. The local Parent Teacher Unit and Mr. H. P. Jewett are circulating Initiative petitions to get this bill on the November ballot. All local registered voters are urged to sign these petitions at once. All petitions have to be turned in within the next ten days.
