Repeatedly, even in time of war, the miners have struck. Each time a settlement was forced in favor of the miners. Strikes are encouraged as long as the law permits one party to do as it pleases while restricting the actions of the other.

The coal miners' latest demands amount to union taxation of industry and union control of management.

The people of this country must realize soon that industry and labor must be treated equally under the law or we are headed for government by pressure groups on a scale that will destroy opportunity and personal liberty.
