Feed Price Rise Effect Scanned by OSC Dairymen

The effect of the combined increase in price of feed grains and protein concentrates will be to into \$10 per ton, or an average of

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crease dairy feed prices from \$5.50 about 10 percent, according to a statement issued by the staff of the dairy department at the Oregon State college.

"The direct effect of this increase on the cost of butterfat or milk depends so much on methods of feeding levels of production, and varying practices that the use of any specific figure may be dangerously misleading," the statement said.

"Generally speaking, the increased costs appear to be from 3 to 5 cents a pound for butterfat or an increase of 12 to 20 cents a hundred for 4 percent milk. We strongly advise against the use of this or any other one figure, however, because of other factors involved," the statement continued.

"The current rapid deterioration of a pasture from drouth, the extent of which cannot yet fully be measured, may cause irreparable damage even if heavy rains should occur soon. Other factors are possible reductions of grain and hay crops and a shortage of baling wire."

The actual scarcity in open commercial channels of wheat, barley, oats and the by-products of wheat, which existed before the ceilings

were changed, exceeds in importance the increased feed costs, the statement added.
