

Game Commission News

Twenty-six deer were killed by the 72 hunters participating in the special deer hunt in the Burnt River area, Baker county, from September 22 to September 27. It is announced by the Oregon State Game Commission. The kill included 16 does and 10 bucks. The special season was held for the purpose of reducing a resident deer population that had been increasing the last few years in order to control damage to private lands.

The Canyon Creek archery deer season in Grant county will open on October 6 and extend through October 25. The bag limit in one of either sex and the open area includes a portion of the Canyon Creek game reserve lying north and east of Canyon Creek and described as follows: "Beginning at the mouth of Sheep Gulch Creek on Canyon Creek at a

point approximately 4 miles south of Canyon City, thence south and east along Canyon Creek to the mouth of Middle Fork of Canyon Creek near Wicklup Camp, thence north and east along the Middle Fork and the Indian Butte trail to the summit, thence north and west along the summit past Pine Creek Mountain to Canyon Mountain, thence west down Sheep Gulch Creek to Canyon Creek, the point of beginning."

Archers will be required to check in and out of the area at the station to be located at the Resort. Only long bows and barbed broad arrows may be used and following minimum weights and size are recommended: Bow, not less than 40 pounds; arrow, not less than 1 ounce (437½ grains); arrowhead, not less than 7/8 inch wide and sharp.

Report of the Game Commission biologist stationed at South Twin Lake during the open season from June 29 to August 31 shows that 4,826 anglers trips were made, representing 21,258 man hours, and a total of 10,011 trout taken. The fish weighed 6,495 pounds and varied in length from 6 to 18 inches. Bag limit per angler was 5 fish a day, 10 a week.

PHEASANTS MUST BE TAGGED

With the pheasant season opening October 19, the Game Commission is calling attention of hunters to the fact that all puland game birds must be properly tagged in the area in which they are killed before they may be possessed or transported to any areas in which there is a closed season or lesser bag limit.

All of the Willamette Valley counties will be closed to hunting. In Malheur county the pheasant season will be open from October 19 to November 3 with a daily bag limit of 4 cocks allowed but not more than 8 in any 7 consecutive days or in possession at any one time. The season in the other 20 counties open to pheasant hunting will be from October 19 to November 3 with a daily bag limit of 3 cocks and not more than 6 in any 7 consecutive days or in possession at any one time. The counties open include Coos, Douglas, Josephine, Jackson, Klamath, Deschutes, Crook, Hood River, Wasco, Sherman, Gilliam, Wheeler, Morrow, Umatilla, Union, Wallowa, Baker, Grant, Harney, Lake with the exception of the Summer Lake area in Lake county.

Tagging stations will be maintained at Hood River, Maupin, Sisters, Goshen, Vale, Ontario, Nyssa, Adrain, Juntura, Brogan and Huntington and at all State Police patrol stations in the counties open to hunting. Malheur county stations will be open from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. each day while the Cascade stations will provide 24-hour service. Tags will be sold at a fee of five cents each.

There will be no open season this year on Hungarian partridge, but valley quail may be hunted from October 19 to October 27 in the following counties: Douglas, Josephine, Coos, Jackson, Klamath, Crook, Deschutes, Grant and Wasco. Bag limit is 5 a day but not more

than 10 in any 7 consecutive days or in possession at any one time.

Blue or sooty grouse may be taken from October 12 to October 25 in Clatsop, Columbia, Tillamook, Curry, Lincoln and that part of Douglas and Lane counties lying west of Highway 99. Bag limit is 2 birds a day but not more than 4 during entire season.
