The present location is grown up to willows and is so full of sediment etc. that it does not allow the waters to run off. Also in another place it runs along the county road grade and there was danger, not only of cars getting into the creek but also of washing away the grade. The County Court is therefore paying a part of the cost of this local flood control project and land owners are paying the balance.

The land through which the creek runs is all improved land and has been leveled and some of the best land in our district is located in this lining.

Limlinger Sand and Gravel Co. east of Central Point have the contract to move the creek.
