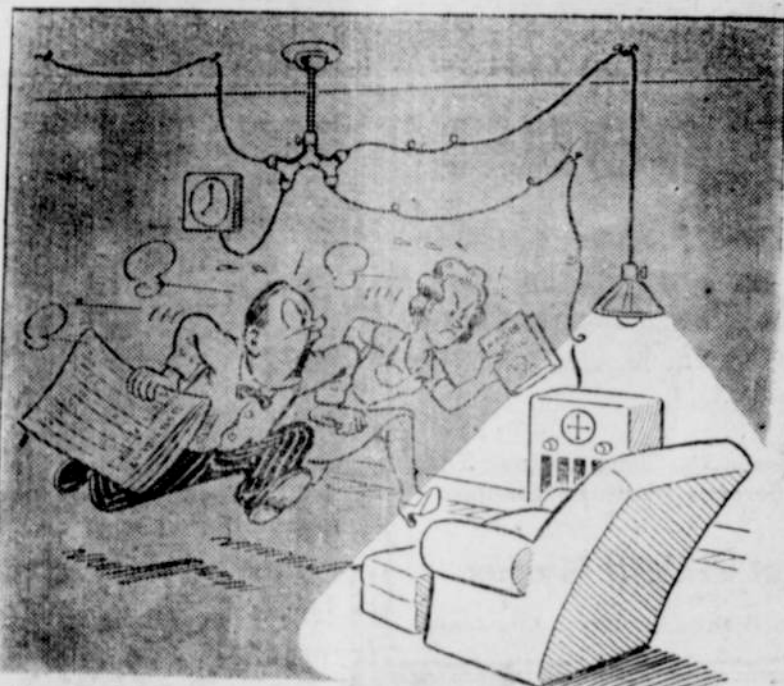
plains in current talks to homemakers in Wasco, Benton, and Washington counties. Mrs. Little is discussing with parents "How Your children Would Like You to Be."
