NEW 5c AIR MAIL STAMPS

The postoffice department will issue a new 5c air mail stamps which will be placed on sale at Washington D.C. on March 26, 1947. Collectors desiring first day covers, may send not to exceed 10 addressed envelopes to the postmaster, Washington 13, D. C. with money order or postal note remittance to cover the cost of stamps to be affixed. This new stamps will be of the same color but will be smaller than the present 5c air mail stamps and will replace the present stamps when the supply is exhausted.
