Mr. Ackerman explained that new, improved air-conditioning is an outstanding feature, providing clean-

washed air with exact temperature and humidity controls for maximum comfort under all weather conditions.

GREATER SAFETY

"Velvet-smooth brakes of highest efficiency, under-floor motors, and other 1947 engineering innovations add to safety," Mr. Ackerman pointed out. "These features, plus the traditional dependability of highly-trained Greyhound drivers, combine to provide still greater safety for Greyhound travelers."

More new Super-Coaches will go into service in Oregon and Northern California as fast as they come from the factory, Mr. Ackerman promised, and he said the company plans to replace a large part of the Greyhound fleet in this area with these latest highway cruisers. 1500 new buses, costing \$37,500,000, will be put into service this year throughout the entire Greyhound system.
