WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE?

Herbert Hoover, former President warns present President, Harry Truman, that the rate of gifts and loans to foreign countries can not continue "without further evil consequences to our stability."

At the same time, Senator Vandenberg, president of the Senate, advises President Truman that our foreign aid program must be based on a "total balance sheet," that charts American ability to provide ships and services for world rehabilitation. But the present President must dismiss the notion that he can ignore Congress.

Truman has not only slipped—he has fallen from the heights to the pavement. It is too bad, because a few months ago he was applauded when he promised to join in non-partisan programs with the Congress. The compact seems to have ended.
