Letter from Washington

The nature of the formal end of this session of Congress has not yet been determined as this is written. A session of Congress does not just end automatically. Formal action is required by both houses. Business of the session may be terminated by adjournment, called adjournment sine die. If the session is thus adjourned, the Congress could only reconvene during this calendar year if the President calls a special session. If no such call is made, Congress will assemble again January 3rd, 1948, when the second session of the 80th Congress will begin. This procedure and the January 3rd date conform to Constitutional provisions regarding Congress.

By resolution of both houses, the Congress may do as has been done several times during recent years—simply declare itself in recess until later in the year. Such resolution would provide that the Congress could be called back into active session at any time by the leadership of both houses.

If the session adjourns sine die and a special session is called later by the President, Members will be paid their travel expenses to and from Washington for the special session. If a recess is declared, Members will pay their own travel costs.

If it were not for the situation in Europe, there would be little likelihood of a session of Congress this fall. Unfortunately, it seems that the war-torn countries are not regaining their ability to sustain themselves and reach a normal peacetime status. Whether a little more time will see these economic and social clouds dispelled or whether this country may deem it necessary to aid Europe further remains to be seen. The so-called Marshall Plan contemplates the necessity for our giving further aid.

If the President decides that the Marshall Plan is necessary, such a plan cannot be put into effect until it is approved by Congress and until Congress has appropriated money for it. So, if the President considers the plan not only necessary but urgent and immediately needed, Congress will meet again this year.

All bills and other business pending in Congress now will still be pending when the next session begins. Any bill almost ready for consideration now may come up for early action next year.

Meanwhile, a special committee of nineteen Members of the House will

go into action to take an inventory, first to find out just how much more we can do out to help others before endangering our own economy and our own future strength; and second, to find out how much, or rather how little, is actually needed to start the wheels of normal commerce, industry and agriculture in Europe.

This committee will also be prepared to report to the President and to Congress its suggestions as to just what we should do to be of greatest aid to the countries now in distress.

We are in the midst now of the last minute rush of business before the session ends. My committee has been meeting at 9:00 A.M. each morning. The House, which normally meets at noon, has this week been convening at 10 and 11 o'clock. I have had practically no time in my office in the daytime for nearly two weeks, but this rush will soon be over.
