Memory of Dr. Hyslop To Be Perpetuated

The memory of the late G. R. Hyslop, head of farm crops at Oregon State college, will be perpetuated in the revived Oregon State corn show which is to be resumed as a part of the Pacific International Livestock exposition in Portland October 3 to 11.

A sweepstakes trophy to be awarded annually to the exhibitor of the best corn in the show will commemorate the work of Professor Hyslop in promoting more and better corn production in Oregon throughout his long years of service at the college. A trophy will be kept on public exhibit at the college between shows, with a new name engraved on it annually.

The sixth annual show this fall, now supported by legislative appropriation, will have three divisions—an open class for adults, a 4-H division, and one for the Future Farmers group. About \$1000 will be offered as premiums.

The show is designed to promote production of field corn more nearly to meet the state's needs, and to encourage seed corn production of varieties best suited to this state. Dr. R. E. Fore, professor of farm crops, and Rex Warren, extension crops specialist, are in charge of arrangements.

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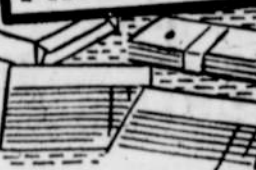
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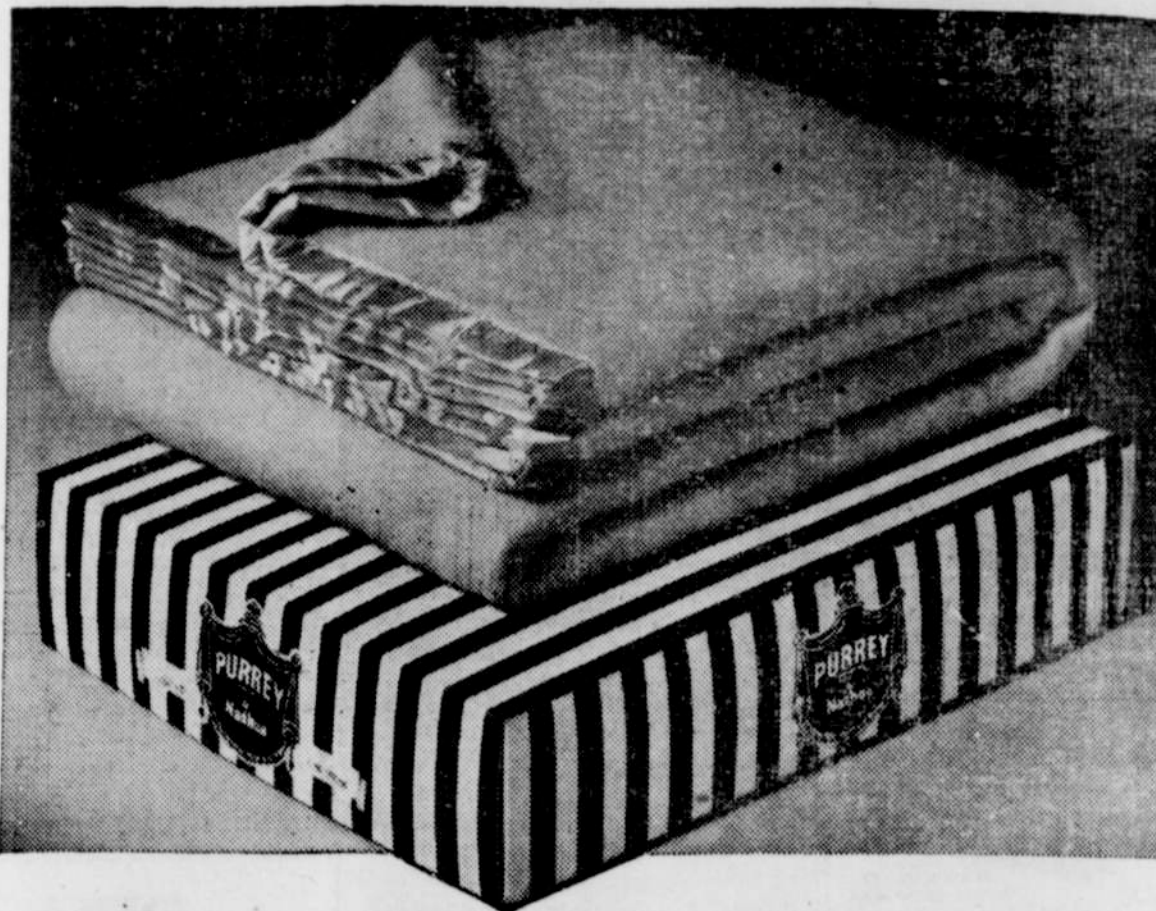
