Registration at U. of O. Week of Sept. 13-20

University of Oregon, Eugene, August 21 (Special)—Fall term registration for both old and new students in the University of Oregon has been announced by Registrar Curtis E. Avery for the week of September 13 to 20.

New students are asked to be on the campus Sunday, September 14, for a mass meeting, when the registration procedure will be explained and when the appointments are to be given out. These appointments, Mr. Avery explains, are made previously on the basis of the returned enrollment cards. Enrollment cards are sent to all new students admitted and to all old students who were registered in the university during the spring term. At the time these cards are filled out and returned to the registrar's office the appointment for the individual is recorded. It is very important, he emphasizes, that these cards be returned as soon as possible.

Appointments start Monday morning, and continue through the week with both old and new students being registered during the period.

Under a new plan this year health examination blanks are being sent to all new students, to be taken to the family doctor for filling out. This is done with the feeling that the family doctor, knowing the background of the individual, can necessarily give a more comprehensive examination and analysis. Formerly the health examination was a part of registration week. This health blank is to be brought to the campus by new students and filed as a part of their registration procedure.

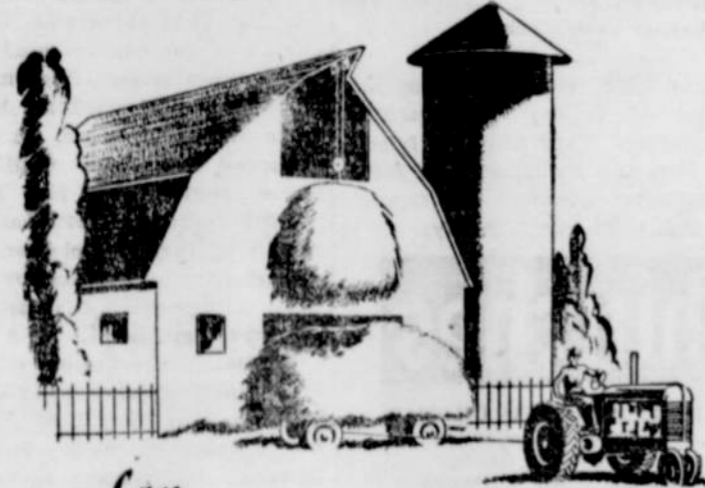
