

Gilbert & Sullivan Plays to be Given

The American-Savoy Gilbert & Sullivan Comic Opera Company will present a limited season of the immortal comedies from the pens of

those masters of mirth and melody Gilbert & Sullivan at the Craterian Theatre Wednesday August 27 and 28. This is the second annual Medford engagement, following engagements in the Northwest, Canada, six weeks in Hollywood, thence through the "deep south."

The company hailing from San Francisco, where they have played several successful seasons in extended runs, embraces an operatic troupe made up of many artists from famous Gilbert & Sullivan companies throughout the United States, Canada and Europe. Many of the stars have appeared in Grand Opera both in the United States and abroad.

Marsden Arzall, Baritone famed in Opera in France and Italy and Virginia Blair, petite auburn-haired prima donna, also well known in opera circles, while on tour was flown to San Francisco to sing the role of "Marguerite," in "Faust," at the request of Mr. Callo as their soprano was ill which would mean cancelling the performance at the San Francisco Opera House. Miss Blair was given a grand ovation by the public and critics alike.

Many others of the famous cast who appeared in the first Medford engagements will again be heard including Everett Nygaard, Henri Scanlon; Thomas Glynn, just returned from New York where he was in support of Dorothy Gish in "The Story of Mary Suttat" and Vicki Vale, well known in light operas and movie musicals.
