WILL WONDERS NEVER CEASE? NO!

A product that is truly amazing has just been developed. Out of wartime research came the proximity fuse, a tiny radio sending and receiving station which fired the shell in which it was located as it came within a certain distance of the target.

That's a technical part of our lengthy peacetime report. But the short-short story "pipes" down to reveal the fact that the Allen-Howe Electronics Corporation took possession of a destructive weapon and tamed it at Peabody, Massachusetts, and put in into practical use for the benefit of hard-of-hearing folks.

Presto change—The Denver Post and The Advertising Age announced the first commercial application of the "printed electronic circuit" secret of the recent World War proximity fuse.

Out of this has been developed the new-type hearing aid in which the printed circuit is used. Some of us newspapermen followed up the symposium at the National Bureau of Standards, and after applying the little new wonder to our own ears found that our own eyes popped open with amazement. Apparently subminiature vacuum tubes, a small transformer, a miniature microphone, tiny batteries, a three position tone control and volume control constitute an entirely assembly that is housed in an aluminum case ready to withstand the roughest treatment its user can give it.

And could we hear? It was a plain as Lowell Thomas over the air.

Mr. Louis Leon Strauss, Jr. saw lots of people at the Willard Hotel in Washington while he told us that the new printed circuit eliminates about 173 individual parts that are in the ordinary hearing-aid sets. Anyway it does produce "perfect hearing" and saves millions or repeats of that ancient question: "What did you say?"

You'll be reading and hearing a lot about this new "printed electronic circuit" in the next few weeks and months, and if John Q. Public becomes as enthusiastic as the Washington journalists he will certainly welcome this new electronic wonder.

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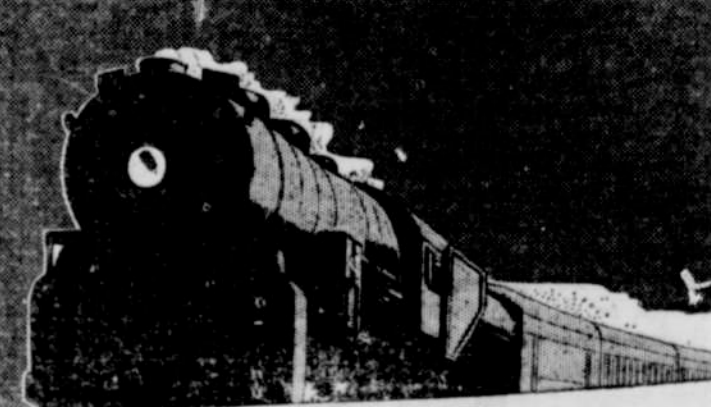
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
