The Pointers started out strong and held a 9-6 advantage at the end of the first quarter. Ashland's fast break began working in the 2nd quarter and the Pointers found themselves on the short end of a 25-14 score at the half. The 2nd Half was even as the Pointers scored 15 points to Ashland's 14.

Information on U.N. Obtainable at Univ.

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, January 8 (Special)—A central clearing house for information concerning the United Nations has been established at the University of Oregon school of education, according to Dean Paul B. Jacobson. The service, in the form of a correspondence center, is for the benefit of teachers of the state, to enable them to get information as quickly and easily as possible. It is set up by the university in conjunction with the U.N. department of public information.

In charge of the new correspondence center, installed by the university at the invitation of the United Nations, is Dr. Hugh B. Wood, director of the curriculum laboratory in the school of education.

The new center, one of a nationwide network of state centers, will mean that Oregon teachers wishing to know more about the United Nations will have a place in their own state to which they can turn for information and teacher aids. The volume of mail at the U.N. headquarters at Lake Success often delays replies.

Sets of United Nations literature for use in answering specific inquiries about U.N. organs, activities accomplishments, and publications, will be available at the Oregon center. In addition, there will be a limited supply of material which can be given to the schools or loaned for display purposes.
