HOW TO DO THE IMPOSSIBLE

It was a tense moment in a critical world series game. It was the fifth inning, the score tied, four to four. One of the greatest pitchers in the game was on the mound for Chicago. At the plate stood the mightiest batsman of all time, Babe Ruth. The pitcher did not fear him too much this time for he had hit a home run in the first inning and surely that was the only home run he had in his system for that day. The crowds cheered and the Cubs jeered.

The pitcher put one straight across the plate. Babe Ruth held up one finger of derision. Straight as an arrow the second ball came whizzing across the plate. Babe Ruth held up two fingers of derision. Pandemonium reigned. Was it possible that like the mighty Casey, he would strike out in this crisis? Suddenly the most contemptuous and audacious thing was done by the batter. He raised his finger and pointed straight across the fence to indicate where he proposed to hit the ball. But the pitcher, too, was contemptuous. He went into his windup and the ball came whistling straight across the plate. There was a sharp crack and in a beautiful arc the ball sailed straight and true just where he had pointed over the fence. It was an electric moment, an unforgettable episode in the history of American sport.

But that's not the most important point in this story. After the game somebody asked Babe Ruth, "But suppose you had missed that final strike?" A look of surprise came over the Babe's face. "Why," he said, "I never even thought of such a thing." Which is precisely the reason he did not miss that ball.

Here is illustrated one of the profound laws of human nature; namely, when you take into your mind the thought of impossibility, you create the conditions of impossibility. Prior to the taking of such a thought, your entire being; body, mind and spirit, works as a harmony. The powerful positive forces of the universe flow through you. You are a coordinated symphony of tremendous power. But when you change the cast and slant of your mind so that you hold the

idea that something is impossible, you block yourself to the flow of this power. The fine balance is lost. You become rigid. In the case of a baseball player, his timing is interfered with just enough to make the fraction of a difference whereby the ball will pass above or below the ball rather than meet it squarely. Similarly in the circumstances of your life, the easy demonstration of power will be lacking. The idea of the impossible has gotten into your mind. Nothing is more tragic. Successful living depends upon eliminating negative thoughts.

In Christianity among other blessings is a mechanism for making the impossible easy. It says "If you have faith, even as a grain of mustard seed, nothing shall be impossible unto you." Again it says, "I can do all things through Jesus Christ who giveth me the strength." And again it says, "With men this is impossible; but with God all things are possible."

The army engineers corps has a motto, "The difficult we do immediately, the impossible takes a little longer." God and you form an inviolable combination. Make that the dominating thought of your mind—God and you are undefeatable—then things which heretofore you counted impossibilities will become easy and victory will crown your efforts. This sounds extravagant, but it makes no difference how it sounds, it is the truth and it works when you believe and practice it.
