

Music Department Rehearsing Concert

Lovers of popular music, as well as classical music, will be interested in the coming spring concert, which will be presented by the high school music department Thursday evening, March 25 in the gym under the direction of Harry Meyers, music instructor.

A mixed chorus of approximately eighty will render five songs: "Almighty God, Carmena, Still of the Night, Hallelujah, and the Negro Spiritual, Old Ark's A-Moverin'."

The orchestra will play Rosamund Overture by Schubert and Waltz of the Flowers by Tchaikowski.

The girls' trio, composed of Janet Merritt, Nancy Hunter, and Jean Kincaid, will present some music in the popular vein with some special lighting effects prepared by Mr. Meyers.

The Bass Choir of about eleven will also present some popular numbers, and an all-girl string ensemble will be heard for the first time here.

The band will play Prelude from Travata by Verdi, among other numbers. Jean Kincaid will give a clarinet solo, accompanied by the band.

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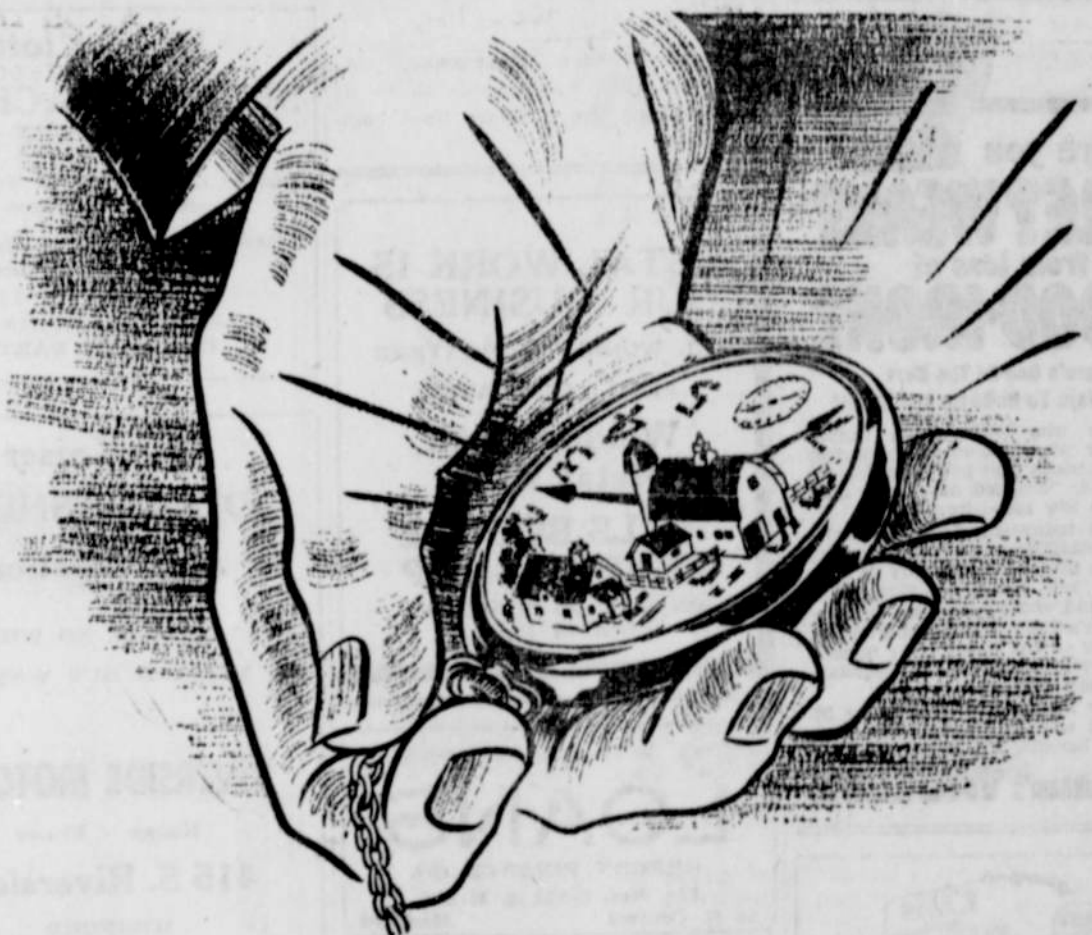
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
