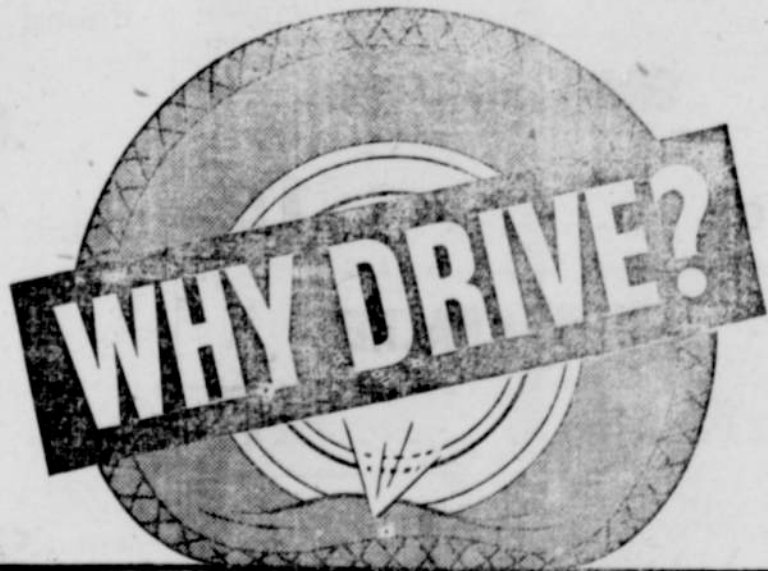

W. H. "Heine" Fluhrer is an experienced business man and has long been active in public affairs in Jackson County. Fluhrer is a YMCA director, Mason, Shriner, Rotarian, Elk, Legionnaire, VFW member, Lutheran, a life long republican, president of First Federal Savings Loan Association, director White City Lumber Company and stockholder Medford Corporation.

We feel "Heine" Fluhrer would be an ideal senatorial representative from Jackson County because he has actively worked for this section of the state for many years, has demonstrated outstanding business ability and would insist on efficient operation of state government.
