### Copco Report Shows Increase in Revenue

The California Oregon Power Company reports gross operating revenues for the twelve months ending April 30, 1948, of \$8,037,518, an increase of 13% over revenues for the same period ending in 1947. Gross revenues for the month of April 1948 totaled \$700,402 an increase of 19% over the same month of last year.

In releasing these figures A. S. Cummins President of the Company stated that consumption of electricity by residential customers during the twelve months ending April of this year increased 26% over the previous period and averaged 3,790.65 kilowatt-hours, a an average cost of 1.702 cents.

that has been started with the O.S.C. experiment station the "key station" for the 11 western states.

This is a cooperative federal-state regional study similar to the one now in progress dealing with rural nutrition in relation to health. The U.S. bureau of human nutrition and home economics is directing a national study of farm residence construction of which this regional study is a part, financed under the Hopo-Flanagan act of 1946.

Miss Maud Wilson, housing research specialist at O.S.C. is regional chairman for the western states. She has worked closely with officials in Washington D.C. for several years in laying the groundwork for the national project. R. S. Bease, acting director of the O.S.C. experiment station, is regional coordinator of the project.

The study will be conducted in three steps—first will consist of interviews with farm families about their housing needs and desires; next will come the detailed study of the answers obtained and finally the use of these answers and other data in developing additional house plans found most useful in the various sections of the west.

When these original plans, developed from the "grass roots," are completed, they will be added to those now made available to the

public through the farm building plans service of the state extension services.

One hundred farm homes in 28 of Oregon's counties will be visited by trained interviewers between now and July 1. The areas in each county to be visited and the numerical method of selecting a few houses in each area were both worked out by statistical specialists. The method, similar to that used in public opinion polls, is supposed to give an accurate random sample with the fewest possible visits.
