DETROIT, June 17—Judging of model automobiles built by Oregon youths and entered in the 1948 competition of the Fisher Body Craftsman's Guild will begin July 8, it was announced here today by W. S. McLean, Guild secretary.

Oregon youths who have built model cars in this year's \$65,000 competition are being instructed to send them to Detroit for judging. There, judges will pick seven winners in the senior and the junior divisions to receive state awards, the top award in each division being \$150. First award winners in both divisions then will compete with winners from Washington for regional honors. The two regional winners from the Oregon—Washington area will receive expense free trips to the Guild's national convention in Detroit in August.

At the national convention eight winners will be selected to receive university scholarships.

McLean said indications are that the number of models to be submitted in this year's competition will be the largest in the Guild's 18-year history.
