The prizewinner, "Rogueland Peaches Honey," was one of eight animals taken to the exposition by Mr. and Mrs. Biles. They took 12 different prizes at the show.

An aged bull called "Royal" took second place honors in his class, and an aged cow, "Mary," took fifth, and "Julie" sixth. An animal five years old or over is classed as aged.

The Biles' yearling herd placed second and their graded herd third. The other prizes won by the exhibits of the Gold Hill couple included a third prize for a pair of animals entered in the class of those owned and bred by exhibitors, and a second prize for a two-year old named "Mona."
