Plans Complete For Catfish Derby

Final arrangements have been completed for the 13th annual National Catfish derby to be held at 1 o'clock Sunday afternoon, June 19, at TouVelle state park under sponsorship of the Medford 20-30 club, according to John Crockell, general chairman.

State park officials report that everything is in readiness for the large crowd that is expected and persons wishing to come early and bring their lunches are invited to do so. Complete picnic facilities are available and refreshment stands will open at 11 o'clock.

The program will start promptly with the coronation of Queen Diane I, who will accept the royal scepter on behalf of her loyal subjects, the catfish of the nation.

Following the coronation ceremonies there will be a program of entertainment and contests conducted by Master of Ceremonies Dick Schuchard. The program will be on the order of an old-fashioned country style picnic and prizes will be presented to winners. Some of the events are pie eating contests for boys and girls, a contest for the oldest car, a whisker contest and awards for the oldest man, the youngest twins, boy with the shortest hair and others.

Last event of the afternoon will be the judging of catfish entries by Kingfish Frank Perl and Frank DeSousa. Fishermen have reportedly been active all week and competition for the sweepstakes trophy is expected to be keen. Prizes will also be awarded for the heaviest catfish, the most catfish, the youngest and oldest catfishermen and an award to the best all-round lady fisherman.
