Shakespeare Plays Bring High Praise

ASHLAND, ORE.—Earthquakes and forest fires, dock strikes and arms, aid have been headline topics this past week, but visitors to this quiet Siskiyou mountain town have also been concerned with the problems which faced subjects of Queen Elizabeth 350 years ago. Theatre-goers attending the opening performances of the Oregon Shakespearean Festival have found the troubles of 1600 to be those of today, too.

Excellence of the five plays being presented in the 1949 drama program has been acclaimed by more than 2000 persons who have been seated under the stars before the outdoor Elizabethan stage. Festival directors report that advance reservations for the remainder of the season point to the largest attendance in the nine-year history of the festival.

Commenting on the opening performance of "Romeo and Juliet," Oregon Journal staff writer noted: "The theatre under the big dipper proved a thrilling experience. Excellent acting made realistic through colorful costuming and smooth fast-paced action enthralled an appreciative audience."

Critic Myna Brunton Hughes of San Francisco praised the second night's performance: "Richard II" is one of my prime favorites; I am very particular about it; I have never seen it better performed."

Eric Allen in the Medford Mail Tribune said of "Midsummer Night's Dream": "The production, while not perfection, came as near to it as you are likely to see in many a long day away from the larger centers of the theatre. . . You will be well paid by a visit to fairyland when it returns to the Lithia park stage."

Herbert Larson, drama editor of The Oregonian, commented about "Othello": "Shirt-sleeve Shakespeare hit its stride on balmy Friday night in this town's Elizabethan theatre. . . with a cast of experienced and capable players, several of whom gave performances equal to professional standards."

The five-play repertory will continue through August 24 with curtain time at 8:30 each evening.

"Romeo and Juliet" will be seen again on August 8, 13, and 19; "Richard II" on August 9, 15, and 20; "Midsummer Night's Dream" on August 10, 16, and 22; "Othello" on August 11, 17, and 23; and "The Taming of the Shrew" on August 12, 18, and 24. Theater and housing reservations may be made by writing to the Oregon Shakespearean Festival at Astland, Oregon.

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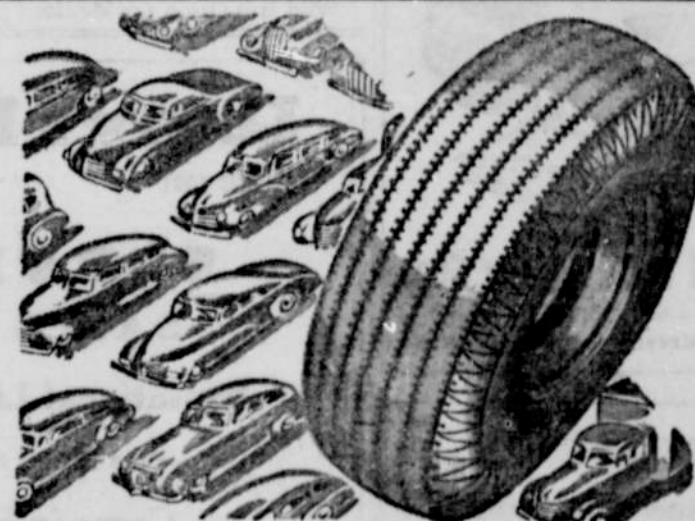
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
