Notice is hereby given that the City of Central Point, Oregon will receive sealed bids up to 7:30 P.M., Nov. 15, 1949, at the City Hall, Central Point, Oregon, at which time all bids will then and there be opened and publicly read aloud, for the furnishing of all materials and machinery, and constructing a sewage pumping plant, complete in operating condition, and a pressure line to convey sewage from the pumping plant to the Medford-Camp White trunk line.

The major features of the plant are: A reinforced concrete screening and grit chamber with mechanically cleaned bar screens; pump station and pumps; and chlorinator building.

The approximate quantities of major construction work are as follows:
