THOMAS DAVENPORT OF VERMONT
INVENTED THE FIRST COMMERCIAL
SUCCESSFUL ELECTRIC MOTOR
IN 1837.

IN 1839 PROFESSOR HANS CHRISTIAN ØRSTED OF THE
UNIVERSITY OF COPENHAGEN DISCOVERED THAT ELECTRICITY
FLOWS THROUGH WIRE. STRANGELY ENOUGH THIS DISCOVERY
WAS MADE WHILE ØRSTED WAS TEACHING A CLASS AT
THE UNIVERSITY. HE ACCIDENTALLY BROUGHT A WIRE
CARRYING A CURRENT FROM A BATTERY NEAR A COMPASS
NEEDLE AND NOTICED THAT THE NEEDLE MOVED IN
THE DIRECTION OF THE FLOW OF THE CURRENT.
