

Boy Scouts Planning For National Jamboree

The Boy Scouts of America have completed plans for the Second National Jamboree of the Boy Scout, to be held at Valley Forge, Pennsylvania on June 31 to July 6, 1950. This will be the world's largest Scout camp ever held, over 40,000 outstanding Scouts and leaders will set up camp on General Washington's old camp ground.

Dr. Charles W. Lemery has been appointed by H. D. Christensen, President of the Crater Lake Area Council as the Chairman of the Council Jamboree Committee.

The Crater Lake Area Council, Josephine, Jackson and Siskiyou Counties have only been allowed a quota of two full Troops of 60 Scouts and 8 Leaders. Scout applications for the trip are now nearing completion with 54 reservations in the Scout office. The remaining 12 reservations must be in headquarters by the 1st of March, stated Dr. Lemery. Up until now, we have held space for each Troop to send a delegate but the remaining twelve reservations are now open to any Scout who is 12 years old and who will be First Class Rank before the end of March.

Outstanding men have been selected as the leaders of the Scouts on the trip, which will leave on the 18 of June and return on or about the 12th of July.

We will have our own special train for the entire trip. Our Scouts

will be on this train with Scouts from Salem, Eugene, Klamath Falls, making up a train of more than 285 Scouts. We will travel by pullman in airconditioned cars with our meals served on the trains. Our route will be to Los Angeles, Grand Canyon, Albuquerque, Denver, St. Louis, Pittsburgh, 2 days in Washington, D.C., Jamboree at Valley Forge, Philadelphia, 2 days in New York City, Niagara Falls, Canada, Detroit, Chicago, Black Hills of South Dakota, Yellowstone Park, Spokane and home. Side trips and excursions are the highlights of the whole trip. At Valley Forge, all the Boy Scouts will eat enough pancakes to stack up twice as high as the Washington Monument, said Dr. Lemery in describing this Scout expedition.

He urges parents of Scouts, who are not registered for the Jamboree, to give their son this Scout opportunity of a life time and get the registration in immediately.

On the opposite side of the front page is a pleasant subject. The one about birds. The only PEST bird is the English sparrow; not because it is a sparrow but because it is so quarrelsome that it drives away almost all of the other birds we would like to have around. Sparrows infest our neighborhood by the

hundreds. I shoot at them and they are gone for quite a spell. But that is like the Judge telling a bum to get out of town; he has to go to some other town so in the long run nobody gains.

It is true that birds do a great deal of damage to crops, but it is also true that they benefit the crops, probably to a greater extent, by killing off pest insects etc.

Intelligent farmers are letting the grass and weeds and brush grow along their fences as cover for the birds. (Naturally they try to control obnoxious weeds).

Our state game and wild life commission is introducing the Multiflora Rose as a hedge for farm land instead of fences. In a few years it forms a fence which stops cattle and at the same time provides

shelter for quail and pheasant and other pest destroying feathered friends of the farmer. The hedge can be trimmed and kept in shape for less than it costs to maintain an orderly and clean wire fence.

Yes, it pays to feed the birds during the winter months, and more important, to supply them with fresh water during the long freezing spells we have had the last two seasons.
