names of Rogue River Chiefs or we would be stumbling over such names as Togunhea, Apserkaka, or Echkatawa. Certainly the name Tolo is more short and euphonious. It is not on record that Tolo ever visited the valley although he was invited to do so by Elisha Steele in 1852. He did go with Steele to Shasta valley in search of Scar Face who killed Woodman on the Klamath. Later Steele with some Shasta Indians visited Fort Lane in search of Scar Face but did not find him. He was later caught on the Salmon river branch of the Klamath.

Another misnomer is the name Modoc attached to Orchards near Table Rock. The Modocs never lived in this valley but were Indians from East of the Mountains near Tule Lake. However the name Modoc is again more musical than the name Tolo. To Tin which according to Lieut. Emmons of Wilkes expedition was the name of the Rogue River tribes.
