## Weird All-Star Cast Makes Up Moody Film

The weirdest all-star cast yet turned out in Hollywood is featured in the scientific film "Dust or Destiny" which was shown in the auditorium this morning at 11:00.

The cast is composed mostly of homing pigeons, fish, plover and bats.

Wonders of the human body are compared with the marvelous provisions made for creatures of the animal kingdom. The film illustrates the workings of the human brain, ear and heart.

Bats own magic "radar" which steers them perfectly in darkness has been captured in this film. Using specially built microphones, Moody technicians discovered that a roomful of "silent" bats really make a continuous din, and they fly from their own echoes.

The peculiar Southern California phenomenon, the grunion run, was filmed for the first time in "Dust or Destiny". The annual antics of the pint-sized fish which dance on the beaches from Santa Barbara to the Mexican border were filmed in their entirety by Moody scientists.

"Dust or Destiny" is the fourth such film produced under the direction of Irwin A. Moon, of the Moody Bible Institute of Science.
