Notice hereby is given that at the school district bond election hereby called to be held at the following polling places within said school district, to-wit: at the high school gymnasium building in the city of Gold Hill, and at the high school gymnasium building in the city of Central Point, in and for School District No. 6 of Jackson County, Oregon, the 24th day of April, A.D., 1950 between the hours of 2 o'clock p.m., and 8 o'clock p.m., there will be submitted to the legal voters thereof the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness in the sum of \$500,000.00 for the purpose of providing funds with which to construct high school buildings, to equip and to furnish the same, and to acquire all property, real and personal, appurtenant thereto or connected therewith in and for said school district.

The vote to be by ballot upon which shall be the words "Bond," "Yes" and "Bonds No" and the voter shall place a cross (X) between the word "Bonds" and the word "Yes," or between the word "Bonds" and the word "No," whichever indicates his choice.
