**Report Shows Work Of City Departments**

The activity report of the city superintendent for the quarter ending March 31 shows that the city is still gradually growing. Five new water connections were made during the quarter. It also shows that a good deal of work was done in keeping up the water meters and lines.

The old fire hall was remodeled and re-wired. New fire doors were installed and the trucks are now run into the building crossways and come out on the Third street side. The old air warning sirens which used to be on the tower on top of the city hall have been installed on the fire hall and connected up with the fire warning system, thus giving better alarm in case of fire.

The big grader has been kept busy as often as weather permitted. 716 yards of granite were purchased and placed on the streets in various parts of town. Street intersections have been widened and gravelled making the turning of corners much easier.

Work on the house numbering project is going forward as fast as possible. In a short time the numbers will be allocated and notices mailed to the property owners.

**SCHOOL DISTRICT BOND ELECTION NOTICE**

SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 66—ss.

Notice hereby is given that at the school district bond election hereby called to be held at the following polling places within said school

district, to-wit: at the high school gymnasium building in the city of Gold Hill, and at the high school gymnasium building in the city of Central Point, in and for School District No. 6 of Jackson County, Oregon, the 24th day of April, A.D., 1950 between the hours of 2 o'clock p.m., and 8 o'clock p.m., there will be submitted to the legal voters thereof the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness in the sum of \$500,000.00 for the purpose of providing funds with which to construct high school buildings, to equip and to furnish the same, and to acquire all property, real and personal, appurtenant thereto or connected therewith in and for said school district.

The vote to be by ballot upon which shall be the words "Bonds Yes" and "Bonds No" and the voter shall place a cross (X) between the word "Bonds" and the word "Yes," or between the word "Bonds" and the word "No," whichever indicates his choice.

The polls for the reception of the ballots cast for or against the contraction of said indebtedness will, on said day and date and at the places aforesaid, be opened at the hour of 2 o'clock p.m., and remain open until the hour of 8 o'clock p.m., of the same day, at which hour the same will be closed.

Notice hereby is further given that the district school board of said school district for the purposes of aforesaid bond election has divided said school district into two election precincts, one of which consists of all that part of said school district lying and being within election precincts numbered 78 (Gold Hill north), 79 (Gold Hill south), 80 (Foothills Creek) and 76 (Rogue River) as established by order of the County Court of Jackson County, Oregon as election precincts for general elections and all legal school voters of said school district residing within said general election precincts shall vote at said election at the high school gymnasium building in the city of Gold Hill; the other of said election precincts of said school district consists of all that part of said school district lying and being within election precincts numbered 69 (Central Point west, 70 (Central Point northeast), 71 (Central Point southeast), 73 (Mound), 72 (Willow Springs), and 74 (Sams Valley), as

established by order of the County Court of Jackson County, Oregon as election precincts for general elections and all legal school voters of said school district residing within said general election precincts shall vote at said election at the high school gymnasium building in the city of Central Point.
