SOCE TOPS LOCAL NINE

Last Sunday on the local diamond Southern Oregon College tipped the Central Point Studs 9 to 5. The college nine, playing their best ball of the season, came from behind in the fourth inning to score six runs on two hits, two walks and three errors. Central Point scored two runs in the first inning on a base on balls to Gitzen, a single by McDonald, followed by an infield tap by Mellbye to the SOCE shortstop who overthrew second on a fielder's choice.

Central Point scored again in the fifth when Mellbye reached first on an error by Gray, SOCE third baseman, and Norm Lucich doubled to right field, scoring Mellbye.

In the ninth the studs scored two more runs on a walk to McDonald and Roelandt scored him with a single to right-field and went all the way when the SOCE fielder let the ball get through him for an error.

The player selected this week is

Mellbye throws and bats right handed. This year with Central Point he will do duty on the mound and when not pitching he will be in the infield. "Mel" stands six feet and weighs 185 pounds.

In the summers when he attended college he played semi-pro ball in the Oregon State League. He is known as a deadly hitter and he should hit his stride as soon as the warmer weather arrives. He is a ball player that should be very popular with the local fans.
