The eighth inning of Wednesday night's Chicago-Brooklyn game was marked by the kind of confusion known only to Brooklyn.

With Jack Robinson on third and Gil Hodges on second, Eddie Miksis bounded to Third Baseman Bob Ramazzotti. The latter's throw chased Robinson back to third where he found Hodges waiting. Catcher Mickey Owen tagged both and Umpire Jocko Conlan called Hodges out, ruling that Robinson was entitled to third base.

Owen then threw to Wayne Terwilliger at second in an attempt to get Miksis. As he did so, Hodges Robinson and Owen started a race for the plate. It was Jackie first, Gil second and the Chicago catcher third.

As Robinson slid across the plate he was tagged by First Baseman Phil Cavarretta of the Cubs. Umpire Art Gore ruled Robinson out because Hodges interfered.

The official scorer ruled the double play: Ramazzotti to Owen to Terwilliger to Cavarretta, the catcher getting a putout at third and the first baseman one at the plate.
