## Juniors Girls Take Top Honors At Track Meet

The junior girls have again stepped into the sports limelight by rolling up 42½ points to take first place in the interclass track meet held on May 17. The senior boys share top honors by taking the boys' first place with a total of 33.

Following the juniors in the girls'

class were the freshmen with 23½ points, the sophomores with 8½ points and seniors with 2½ points.

In the boys' competition the sophomores placed second with 23, the juniors third with 11 and the freshmen last with 10 points.

Complete listings of class placings in each event are as follows:

Girls' high jump: juniors first; seniors and freshmen tied for second and third; and freshmen and sophomores tied for fourth.

Girls' 60 yard dash: juniors first; juniors second; freshmen, third; and sophomores, fourth.

Girls' standing broad jump: juniors first; sophomores, second; freshmen, third; and freshmen and seniors tied for last.

Girls' baseball throw: juniors, freshmen; juniors; and seniors.

Girls' basketball throw: freshmen; juniors; freshmen; and sophomores.

Girls' relays: juniors; sophomores; freshmen; and seniors.

This gives the juniors a total of six firsts, two seconds, two thirds and a tie for second and third. The freshmen have one first, two seconds, four thirds, a tie for second, one fourth and two ties for fourth.

The sophomores are third with two seconds, two thirds and a tie for another fourth. The seniors took two fourths and a tie for a fourth.

This gives the seniors five firsts, two seconds, and two fourths. The sophomores are second with two firsts, two seconds, three thirds and one fourth. The juniors follow with one second, three thirds and two fourths. The freshmen are last with two seconds, a third and one fourth place.
