STUDS PLAY ROSEBURG HERE 2:00 PM SUNDAY

The game of the year for the semi-pro league top spot will be played on the Central Point diamond this Sunday, June 18th, when the Central Point Studs meet the Roseburg Chiefs.

Roseburg has a fine record with ten wins and no defeats. Buzz Sporer is the Roseburg leading pitcher. He is down from the Western International League, having pitched for Salem and Victoria in that league for five years. In his last game this season he ran up twenty-two strikeouts. In four Southern Oregon Baseball League games he has shut out the opposition in two of these games.

Roseburg also has three former Central Point players: John (Tex) Chandler, catcher; Cy Whidden, pitcher; and Stan Norby, second base.

The Central Point Studs are slightly handicapped for this game as they have been idle for the past two Sundays. Mound duties for the Studs will be either Paul Gehrman or Clarence Melby with Frank

Roelandt, catching. Don Fawcett, Oregon State College infielder, will be on second base for the Studs. His return to the Stud line-up rounds out the infield with Gitzen on first, Cox on shortstop and Alex McDonald on third base. In the outfield will be Moose Blevins, Norm Lucich and Clarence Melby, when not pitching.

This game should be the top game of the season at Central Point. The Studs have eight wins and one loss and many a baseball expert has claimed this aggregation the best semi-pro ball club ever to come out of Southern Oregon.

This will be the only game in the valley this Sunday, come out and see a good ball game. Game time is 2:00 PM.
