Bank to Pay Increased Interest

Increased interest rates for savings account depositors at The First National Bank of Portland will become effective July 1, it was announced Wednesday by President F. N. Belgrano, Jr. Depositors will receive 1½ interest on all savings accounts up to and including \$10,000 and 1% interest on any amount in excess of \$10,000. This action was taken by the board of directors at their regular June meeting on Wednesday. Belgrano stated that the new rate will apply to both new and existing accounts and that deposits made on or before July 10

will draw interest from July 1. Belgrano pointed out that this increase in interest payments to savings depositors means an increase of 50% to the small depositors who are saving for their security and independence. The rates of interest previously paid by the bank were 1% on the first \$5,000 and ½% on any amount in excess of \$5,000. He stated that the excellent earnings of The First National Bank of Portland have made it possible to increase the interest of savings depositors.

"This increase in savings interest, the recently authorized increase in dividends to stockholders and the adoption of a six-day banking service exemplify not only the strong earning capacity of the bank but also its progressive program in the interest of its customers and stockholders," stated Belgrano.

The institutions affiliated with The First National Bank of Portland were holding special meetings of their boards of directors, also on Wednesday, to consider increasing interest payments to their savings depositors, according to Belgrano. It is his belief that those banks would adopt a policy similar to that of the First National.
