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Meet Our Teachers

The staff of the Central Point Elementary schools is headed by Charles A. Meyer, who is assisted at home on S. 9th street by Mrs. Lorna Meyer and Charla-Jo, a first grader. Mr. Meyer is beginning his 10th year of teaching. Since coming to Central Point five years ago, the grade school has grown from a staff of 12 to nearly 30 teachers, and from 400 to over 800 pupils.

A graduate of Oregon College of Education at Monmouth, "Dutch" attended University of Portland a year following his graduation from Commerce high school in Portland. This past summer he was completing work for his Master's degree in Education at Oregon State College. He began his teaching career in Coquille where he was a teacher of mathematics and social studies in the Junior high and coach in the Junior and Senior high schools. During the war, he spent four years on a naval destroyer.

At Monmouth, he was a member of Theta Delta Phi, an honor society, and at O.S.C. he has become a member of Kappa Delta Pi, an

education honorary. Since coming to southern Oregon, he has served two years as president of Jackson County's Elementary Principals and is now president of Southern Oregon's Elementary Principals.

Mr. Meyer is a member of the Central Point Lions, Eastern Star, and Masons and spends many evenings refereeing ball games throughout Southern Oregon.

EASY TO BANISH BRITTLE HAIR ENDS



If brittle ends and split hair mar the sleekness of your hair style, take a tip from a New York hair stylist Victor Vito. In his book, "Be Your Own Hair Stylist," he recommends rubbing a little baby oil on the ends a couple of times a week.

It's important, too, not to yank at curls with your comb, as this serves only to break off the ends in bunches. Disentangling the snarls patiently; using a wide-toothed comb and a soft-bristle brush all add to the gentle care that helps hair to grow soft and sleekly long.

Various hints for both hair care and hair styling are included in the new book which features step-by-step diagrams on how to pin curl and wind permanent waves, and how to comb the hair to suit facial shape.

44 Years Ago

Thursday, July 6, 1906

Although Central Point did not celebrate this year, her people showed their patriotism by going elsewhere to wave the flag and shoot the festive firecracker. About 200 tickets were sold at the local station for Medford and Ashland, most of the celebrators going to the

latter place for the change, perhaps. 100 went from here to Rogue River and spent the day boating, fishing, wading and eating, as guests of Messers Boswell, Scott, and Gray, at their fishing camp. It was the same old-fashioned, glorious Fourth that Uncle Sam's boys and girls have been celebrating for the past 130 years. What more need be said?

G. J. Post and John Oswell have bought some 200 acres of second crop alfalfa and will cut and haul the same for the seed. The alfalfa seed business is an experiment in this valley but it is believed it will prove highly profitable. Should the experiment prove satisfactory this season Messers Olwell and Post will engage in the same line next season on a more extensive scale.

Notice is hereby given, that on Tuesday, the 7th day of November, 1934, at the General Election held on that day in the South Gold Hill Precinct No. 79, in Jackson County, Oregon, the Measure to determine whether or not a livestock district should be created, to be known and designated as South Gold Hill Livestock District, for the purpose of prohibiting livestock from running at large in that portion of the South Gold Hill Precinct, described as follows:

All of those portions of Sections 16, 17, 19, 20, and 21, Township 36 South, Range 3 West of the Willamette Meridian in Jackson County, Oregon, which portions of said Sections lie south of the southerly shoreline of the Rogue River, and that portion of the West one-half of Section 22, Township 36 South, Range 3 West of the Willamette Meridian in Jackson County, Oregon, south of the southerly shore-line of the Rogue River.

was voted upon. A majority vote was cast for the formation of the livestock district, and all persons are hereby notified that it shall be unlawful for stock to run at large in that portion of the South Gold Hill Precinct described above, after the sixtieth day from the date of the first publication of this notice, under penalty of imprisonment in the county jail not more than one year, or by fine not more than \$500.00, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
