SPARTANS WIN OVER JVILLE AND OAKGROVE

The Central Point Spartans "A" and "B" squads added two victories each over Jacksonville and Oakgrove schools this past Monday and Tuesday nights.

Coach Al Gaspee's charges handled the Jacksonville teams with comparable ease, but against the Oakgrove club the Spartans "A" squad ran into a fast crew that gave the Central Point boys a rough time for the first half by a tight defense and a speedy attack that caught the Spartans off guard. At the end

of the first quarter the Spartans held a 4 to 3 lead. The first half ended with the Spartans leading only 14 to 5. The second half was a different story as the Spartans rolled up 30 points to 16 for Oakgrove. The final score was 44 to 21. The Spartans were not hot on their floor shots with an average of .367, hitting 18 baskets out of 49 shots. From the foul line they were very weak, hitting only 10 out of 30 chances for a .333 average.

POINTERS LOSE TWO GAMES

This past week-end the Pointers dropped two pre-season basketball games to the Myrtle Point Bobcats by the scores of 47-34 and 61-43.
