Scholarship Offered Senior Girls

Another opportunity to apply for a scholarship to the University of Oregon is now available to senior high school girls. The University of Oregon Coed Housing Alumnae Association this year is offering three fee scholarships in the amount of \$55.00 (tuition for one term) to Oregon high school girls who need financial help to attend college. Awards are based on financial need, school performance record, and special talent. By living at one of the cooperative houses and receiving one of these scholarships, basic expenses for the first term would be only \$45 room and board; plus books and incidentals. After you are on the campus for a term it is not hard to find part time jobs to fill out the necessary cash if your savings will not stretch the rest of the way. Also, State scholarships are often available to girls enrolled in the University who can qualify with the required grades.
