

Dan Ehrheart in VA Hospital

Dan Ehrheart, Medford World II veteran and son of Mrs. Lillian Ehrheart, now living in Central Point, is convalescing from spinal surgery at the Portland veteran administration hospital according to news received here this week.

Ehrheart, since his release from the Air Force several years ago, has been working as an electrician at Klamath Falls. When taken to the VA hospital recently he was paralyzed, and his mother has been informed that though he is now unable to walk, he will be able to do so again, she said today.

He was wounded while flying on a mission over New Guinea when the plane he was in was struck by enemy fire, and his present condition is caused by the wound, according to his mother.

He was a captain at the time of

his release and was decorated numerous times for his service. He has been awarded the silver star, bronze star, distinguished flying cross and oak leaf cluster, and three presidential citations as well as other awards according to friends. He was graduated from Medford High school in 1933 and played football during the time Bill Bowerman was Medford High coach. He has a son, Don Ehrheart, 5, who lives in Medford.

Ehrheart was a bomb sight specialist and bombardier and held numerous other jobs during his service, his mother said.

Besides his mother residing in Central Point he has a sister and brother-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. M. G. Cote, niece, Toni Cote and nephews, Glen Cote and Rickie, Route 1 Box 307, Central Point.

Arithmetic Tests Given Crater Hi Juniors

The Basic Skills in Arithmetic Test was given to the Juniors of Crater High School, on March 4, and will also be given to the incoming freshmen this Spring. This test was designed to measure command of forty-three fundamental skills in arithmetical operations involving whole numbers, decimals, fractions, and per cents. The test results provide a basis for the determination of group and individual instructional needs.

In giving it to the eighth graders, it will be possible to determine whether or not the individual student should be scheduled for General Math or Algebra in his freshman year of high school.

By testing the juniors a definite need was found for a class in remedial mathematics which would be offered in the senior year. All those below the median score will be required to take the course.

Tabulation of test scores revealed that the great number of errors and lack of understanding and application occurred in the use of finding what per cent one number is of another, second greatest was in changing per cent to decimals, and third was placing decimal points correctly in division. The sections testing decimals and per cents are the most

frequently used principles in everyday life.

Four students made perfect scores on the test and they were Evelyn Frederick, Don Wisely, LaVonne Pinney, and Shirley Lyman. Marion Smith, Wayne Straus Delton Tucker, Ken Kilbourn, and Kenneth Nutter made only one error. Ninety-six per cent of all students who have taken the test in the United States rank below them in knowledge of these basic arithmetical skills.
