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Star Recipes

Like most wives, Mrs. CORNEL WILDE likes to serve her husband's favorite dishes. Chicken Pilaf plays a star role in Mrs. Wilde's menus—it's delicious, easy to do, and doesn't call for too much time in the kitchen. With an eye on the budget—chicken teams with rice, cleverly seasoned, to make a substantial main dish. Follow with tossed green salad—maybe fruit for dessert and a good cup of coffee—and you've got a complete meal.

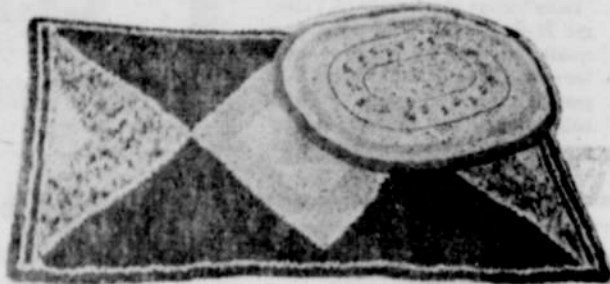
CHICKEN PILAF

1/2 cup Blue Bonnet Margarine 2 teaspoons salt
1/2 cup finely chopped onion 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper
2 cups rice 1 bay leaf
4 cups chicken stock or bouillon 2 cups diced cooked chicken
1/2 cup blanched, toasted almonds

Melt margarine in heavy pan. Add onion. Cook gently until onion is brown. Stir in rice. Add chicken stock or bouillon (may be made from bouillon cubes), salt, pepper and bay leaf. Bring to a boil. Turn into well-greased 2-quart casserole. Cover and bake in moderate oven (350° F.) about 25 minutes until rice is tender and liquid absorbed. It may be necessary to add more stock before rice is cooked. Remove bay leaf. Add diced cooked chicken and almonds which have been sauteed in a tablespoon of hot margarine. Return to oven and bake for an additional 15 minutes. Makes 6 servings. This is a complete meal when served with a green salad.

Know Your Speech Department!

The speech department of Crater High School has won many honors at various contests and yet few people understand what happens. In order to explain this we will have to start from the very beginning.

There are two speech classes at Crater High; the first year speech class and advanced speech. The first year class stresses the fundamentals of speech. In the advanced class more time is spent on contest speaking.

The different types of speaking which speech students entered this year are oratory, extemporaneous, impromptu, after dinner, humorous reading, serious reading, acting, radio, interview, discussion, poetry reading, and debate. There were four debate teams entering contests from our school this year. Two were from the first year class and two from the advanced. At the district meet this year our debate team, Neil Richardson and Shirley Edison, tied for second place with Grants Pass after winning three and losing three debates. Medford received first place after winning four and losing two; Ashland came in last with a two-win, four loss record.

Two of our debate teams got into the finals at the Linfield speech tournament at McMinnville and received championship awards. Fifteen students from Crater High attended this conference and brought

home six championship certificates. The students also went to the Southern Oregon College speech meet and took seven outstanding certificates from there. This year our speech department didn't enter the Willamette and Pacific meets.

Debate, which is a major speech activity, is really arguments backed up by facts. A team is comprised of two persons who have prepared a ten minute speech and debate

another team. Then each member of the team gets a rebuttal period. The team is judged on delivery, the way the arguments are presented, and the best facts and statistics. This just one of the many events a speech student may enter and have the chance of winning.
