## OSC Extension Editor Joins Farm Journal Staff

R. G. Fowler, Jr., information specialist with the Oregon State college extension service for almost five years, will resign effective July 15 to become west coast field editor for Farm Journal, the Nation's largest farm magazine.

He will be one of two western resident editors. The magazine will soon start a special western edition serving the area from Denver to the Pacific.

Following his graduation from OSC in 1939 with a degree in agricultural economics Fowler spent two years with the Colorado extension service before returning to Oregon to take a post with the fore-runner of the present production and marketing administration. He served three and one-half years in

the army air corps during World War II and following discharge became information specialist for the extension service farm labor program.

Later he moved to Berkeley, Cal., as assistant to the western area farm labor director, and returned to OSC in December 1947 to assume the position he is now leaving. In recent years he has become widely known as an agricultural free-lance writer.
